B.Sc. POLITICAL SCIENCE

1. Political science is that branch of the social sciences that studies the state, politics, and government. Political Science deals extensively with the analysis of political systems, the theoretical and practical applications to politics, and the examination of political behavior.
2. Political scientists view themselves as being engaged in fleshing out the connections between political events and conditions, and by this understanding they hope to construct a system of general principles that posit the way the world of politics works.
3. Since political behavior and governance are studied in terms of political philosophy which deals with abstract notions of the role of the state and the relationship of people and the state with an emphasis on understanding the concepts of public welfare and larger social good, both political science and philosophy have common grounds in these aspects.
4. Whereas sociology studies the entire societies, political science is concerned with the political systems that are part of the larger society. The study of the interactions between the people and the state is something that both sociology and political science aim to do and hence, there is a symbiotic relationship between sociology and political science.
5. Finally, political science cannot be a standalone or isolated field as all branches of the social sciences purport to explain the larger questions concerning people and the state. Hence, there are symbiotic relationships between political science and other sub-disciplines of social sciences as they have common ground in their quest to understand how political systems work and how politics and governance play themselves out.

After successful completion of three years degree program in Political Science, students will be able to:

1. Discuss the most important political theorists in the western tradition and the ideas associated with them.
2. Describe basic political and governmental structures, processes, and policies in the U.S. and in several other western and non-western countries.
3. Describe the history, structure, and operation of the international system.
4. Identify the principal arguments for and against alternative forms of government.
5. Explain the role of political ideas, value conflicts, and ideology in human societies.
6. Evaluate alternative political ideas and ideologies.

7. Explain the structural context within which politics takes place, including the role of the economy, society, and culture, and conflicts over and within those domains.
8. Collect, describe, and interpret quantitative data.
9. Write clearly and cogently about political questions, using appropriate language, developing a clear thesis, and supporting that thesis with evidence.
10. Take positions on and argue (orally and in writing) for different political and issue positions.
