- Program outcomes (PO) BA (Hons) Sociology:
- PO1: Introduction to Sociology: Gain inside into nature and scope of sociology and its relationship with other social sciences.
- PO2: Sociology of India: It aims at understanding the family, marriage in Indian society. Religion, social problems in India.
- PO3: Techniques of social research: Enables and guides the students to do social research.
- PO4: Sociological thinkers: Introduces the various Sociologists and social thinkers to the students and enables them to understand societies.
- PO5: Indian sociological tradition: Make the students understand the development of sociology in India and social thinkers in India.
- PO6: Gender sensitization: This course will sensitize students to issues related to gender and equality among all sexes.
- PO7: Introduction to social research: The course is a general introduction to the methodologies of sociological methods.
- PO8: Political sociology: This course introduces students to some major theoretical debates and concepts in political sociology, while situating these within contemporary political issues.
- PO9: Social demography: This course provides a critical understanding of the interface between population and society. It analyses the roles offertility, mortality and migration on the composition, size and structure of population.
- PO10: Indian society images and realities: This course seeks to provide an interdisciplinary introduction to Indian society.
- PO11: Sociological Theory: Provides a general introduction to sociological theories. It also provides a foundation for theories propounded by different thinkers.
- PO12: Sociology of marginal groups: It introduces students to sociological study of socially excluded and marginalized group of the society.
- PO13: Social change and development: This course introduces the concept, nature, factors and forms of changes that takes place in the society.

- PO14: Economic sociology: The course provides an understanding of the social and cultural bases of economic activity. It highlights the significance of sociological analysis for the study of economic processes in local and global contexts.
- PO15: Sociology of gender: The course introduces gender as a critical sociological lens of enquiry in relation to various social fields. It also interrogates the categories of gender, sex, and sexuality.
- PO16: Social stratification: This course introduces students to sociological study of social inequalities. It acquaints students with principal theoretical perspectives and diverse forms of social inequality in articulation with each other.
- PO17: Urban society in India: To provide sociological understanding of urban society in India. To understand about the evolution of cities and urban communities. To make students aware of urban problems in India. To understand urban planning and urban development.
- PO18: Rethinking development: This examines the ideas of development from a sociological perspective. It introduces students to different approaches to understanding development and traces the trajectory of Indian experience with development from an interdisciplinary perspective.
- PO19: Social problems in India: This course attempts to study the concepts of social problems exists in the society and measures to combat with it.
- PO20: Family, marriage and Kinship: This course aims to introduce general principles of family, marriage, and kinship by reference to key terms and theoretical statements substantiated by ethnographies.
- PO21: Agrarian sociology: Gains knowledge of an agricultural society
 And promote improvement in the quality of life of persons living in agricultural community by researching the needs of agricultural community and developing programs to meet those needs.
